RE: THINKING OUR CHALLENGES

"Finding solutions begins with thinking outside the box"



Korean Food Basket Drive: Hanul's very first Food Basket Drive was held to provide Korean groceries to seniors with high-risk difficulties leaving their homes due to extreme weather conditions. It began as an idea through a generous anonymous donor, where we then worked with our local Korean grocery stores to receive discounted rates of food. Hanul Staff and volunteers then put together food baskets and delivered it to 180 seniors in Chicago.

Lake County Lunch Program: Due to limited space at our Lake county office, we had been unable to host our senior congregate meal programs there. However, churches in Lake County have generously offered their space for us to host a monthly lunch and exercise program, allowing for all of our seniors at our three locations to enjoy a healthy lunch.

"Diversifying our revenue streams through new operational model"



Private Home Care Service: Hanul obtained its Private Home Care License that would allow seniors with no Medicaid to receive home care services from Hanul. Revenue incurred from the Private Home Care Service will help fuel our services for low-income seniors.

Social Entrepreneurship: Hanul seniors who used to love to knit and make arts and crafts for themselves are now selling their products on-line. Hanul's Kitchen staff have also begun catering to corporate and social events. 100% of proceeds will go towards the development of our programs and services.

Expanding Our Volunteer Pool: Lunar Ball is Chicago's largest fundraiser for Asian-American young professionals and friends. Hanul has been selected as their beneficiaries in the past two years. Our connection with Lunar Ball Committee will help us expand Hanul's volunteer pool beyond our traditional reach.

Embracing Our Mind and Wellness: In collaboration with local mental health service providers, Hanul has launched Memory Health Initiative and mental health individual and group counseling services. As the community's interest in mental health issues increases, Hanul hopes to provide a safe space to nurture the community's mental wellbeing.

Hanul helps culturally, linguistically and economically isolated immigrant families access needed information and resources so that they can better navigate life challenges. Hanul also ensures our seniors age healthy and safe in their own place by providing community-based senior programs. 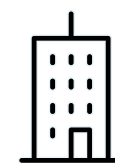

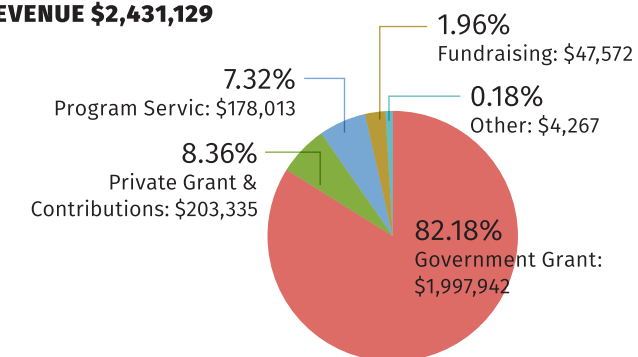

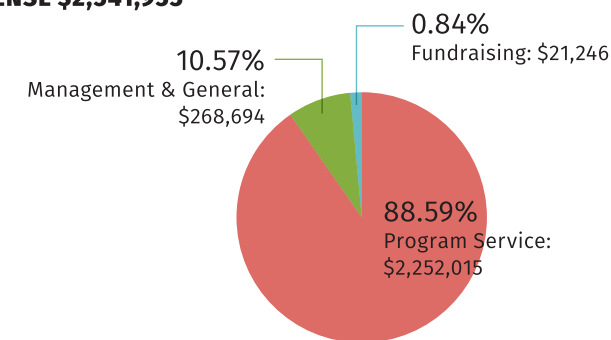
